IOWA COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 38

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE ELECTION PRECINCTS IN ALL AREAS OF IOWA COUNTY, IOWA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF IOWA COUNTY, IOWA:

SECTION 1 -- PURPOSE

The purpose of this ordinance is to establish voting precincts for Iowa County, Iowa. SECTION 2 – <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

For use in this ordinance, the following terms or words shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

"Voting Precinct" or "Precinct" shall mean a county or municipal subdivision for casting and counting votes in elections.

- A. "Township" shall mean a civil and political subdivision of the county, six miles on each side.
- B. "Township Officials" or "Township Officers" shall mean a board of officers to whom the affairs of a township are entrusted.

SECTION 3 – GENERAL PROVISIONS

The boundaries of all precincts to be used for all elections in Iowa County, Iowa, as established and defined as set forth hereinafter:

HONEY CREEK – MARENGO PRECINCT – includes all of Honey Creek and Marengo Townships. This does not include the City of Marengo. Voting in Marengo.

MARENGO CITY PRECINCT – includes only the City of Marengo. Voting in Marengo.

WASHINGTON – HILTON PRECINCT – includes all of Washington and Hilton Townships including census tract 960200, Block 4117 outside of the City of Marengo. This does not include the City of Williamsburg and the City of Marengo. Voting in Conroy.

LENOX – IOWA PRECINCT – includes all of Lenox and Iowa Townships. Voting in Middle Amana.

HARTFORD I – SUMNER PRECINCT – includes that part of Hartford Township lying East of CC Ave. from 160th Street to 170th Street and that portion East of D Ave. from 170th Street to 220th Street. Also included is the City of Ladora and all of Sumner Township. Voting in Ladora.

HARTFORD II – LINCOLN PRECINCT – includes that part of Hartford Township lying West of CC Ave. from 160th Street to 170th Street and that portion West of D Ave. from 170th Street to 220th Street. Also included is the City of Victor located in Iowa County and all of Lincoln Township. Voting in Victor.

PILOT – YORK – TROY PRECINCT – includes all of Pilot, York, and Troy Townships. The City of Williamsburg is not included. Voting in Williamsburg.

WILLIAMSBURG CITY PRECINCT – includes only the City of Williamsburg. Voting in Williamsburg.

DAYTON – ENGLISH I PRECINCT – includes all of Dayton Township and the City of Millersburg and that portion of English Township lying North of 310th Street and West of G Avenue. Voting in Millersburg.

ENGLISH II PRECINCT – includes the City of North English located in Iowa County and that portion of English Township lying South of 310th Street and East of G Avenue. Voting in North English.

FILLMORE – GREENE PRECINCT – includes all of Fillmore and Greene Townships, including the City of Parnell. Voting in Parnell.

SECTION 4 – REPEALER

This ordinance repeals the prior County Ordinance No. 17 on Election Precincts which had an effective date of October 6, 2011.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5 – SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 6 – <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>

This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

WHEREAS, it is hereby found and determined that one or more economic development areas, as defined in Chapter 403, Code of Iowa, exist within the County and the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development, or combination thereof, of the area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, or welfare of the residents of the County; and

WHEREAS, this Board has caused there to be prepared a proposed Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Plan ("Plan" or "Urban Renewal Plan") for the Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Area ("Area" or "Urban Renewal Area"), which proposed Plan is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Plan is to form the Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Area suitable for economic development and to include a list of proposed projects to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area, and a copy of the Plan has been placed on file for public inspection in the office of the County Auditor; and

WHEREAS, the property proposed to be included in the Urban Renewal Area is legally described in the Plan and this Board has reasonable cause to believe that the Area described in the Plan satisfies the eligibility criteria for designation as an urban renewal area under Iowa law and; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the area be redeveloped as part of the overall redevelopment covered by the Plan; and

WHEREAS, portions of the land proposed to be included in the Urban Renewal Area is within two miles of the corporate boundaries, respectively, of the City of Millersburg, Iowa, the

City of Ladora, Iowa, and of the City of Victor, Iowa and the County will enter into a joint agreement with each of these cities to allow the County to operate within the proposed Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has determined that several existing ordinances of the County comprise a general plan for the physical development of the County as a whole, giving due regard to the smart planning principles set forth in Iowa Code Chapter 18B, for the purposes of Iowa Code Section 403.5; and

WHEREAS, this Board has caused there to be prepared a proposed Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Plan ("Plan" or "Urban Renewal Plan") for the Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Area

("Area" or "Urban Renewal Area"), which proposed Plan is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and which is incorporated herein by reference; and

Section 1. That the findings and conclusions set forth or contained in the proposed "Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Plan" for the area of Iowa County, State of Iowa, legally described and depicted in the Plan and incorporated herein by reference (which area shall hereinafter be known as the "Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Area"), be and the same are hereby adopted and approved as the findings of this Board for this area.

Section 2. This Board further finds:

- c) Acquisition by the County is not immediately expected, however, as to any areas of open land to be acquired by the County included within the Urban Renewal Area:
 - i. Residential use is not expected, however, with reference to any portions thereof which are to be developed for residential uses, this Board of Supervisors hereby determines that a shortage of housing of sound standards and design with decency, safety and sanitation exists within the County; that the acquisition of the area for residential uses is an integral part of and essential to the program of the municipality; and that one or more of the following conditions exist:
 - a. That the need for housing accommodations has been or will be increased as a result of the clearance of slums in other areas, including other portions of the urban renewal area.

- b. That conditions of blight in the municipality and the shortage of decent, safe and sanitary housing cause or contribute to an increase in and spread of disease and crime, so as to constitute a menace to the public health, safety, morals, or welfare.
- c. That the provision of public improvements related to housing and residential development will encourage housing and residential development which is necessary to encourage the retention or relocation of industrial and commercial enterprises in this state and its municipalities.
- d. The acquisition of the area is necessary to provide for the construction of housing for low and moderate income families.
- ii. Non-residential use is expected and with reference to those portions thereof which are to be developed for non-residential uses, such non-residential uses are necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the County in accordance with sound planning standards and local community objectives.

Section 3. That the Urban Renewal Area is an economic development area within the meaning of Chapter 403, Code of Iowa; that such area is eligible for designation as an urban renewal area and otherwise meets all requisites under the provisions of Chapter 403, Code of Iowa; and that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development, or a combination thereof, of such area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of this County.

Section 4. That the Urban Renewal Plan, attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference, be and the same is hereby approved and adopted as the "Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Plan for the Diamond Trail Urban Renewal Area"; the Urban Renewal Plan for such area is hereby in all respects approved; and the County Auditor is hereby directed to file a certified copy of the Urban Renewal Plan with the proceedings of this meeting.

Section 1. That the taxes levied on the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area legally described in the preamble hereof, by and for the benefit of the State of Iowa, Iowa County, English Valleys Community School District, Hartwick-Ladora-Victor Community School District, Iowa Valley Community School District, Williamsburg Community School District, City of Ladora, Iowa, and all other taxing districts from and after the effective date of this Ordinance shall be divided as hereinafter in this Ordinance provided.

Section 2. That portion of the taxes which would be produced by the rate at which the tax is levied each year by or for each of the taxing districts upon the total sum of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area, as shown on the assessment roll as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the first calendar year in which Iowa County, State of Iowa, certifies to the Auditor of Iowa County, Iowa the amount of loans, advances, indebtedness, or bonds payable from the division of property tax revenue described herein, shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the fund for the respective taxing district as taxes by or for the taxing district into which all other property taxes are paid.

Section 3. That portion of the taxes each year in excess of the base period taxes determined as provided in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into a special tax increment fund of Iowa County, State of Iowa, hereby established, to pay the principal of and interest on loans, monies advanced to, indebtedness, whether funded, refunded, assumed or otherwise, including bonds or obligations issued under the authority of Section 403.9 or 403.12, Code of Iowa, as amended, incurred by Iowa County, State of Iowa, to finance or refinance, in whole or in part, urban renewal projects undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area pursuant to the Urban Renewal Plan, except that (i) taxes for the regular and voter-approved physical plant and equipment levy of a school district imposed pursuant to Section 298.2, Code of Iowa, and taxes for the instructional support program of a school district imposed pursuant to Section 257.19, Code of Iowa, (but in each case only to the extent required under Section 403.19(2), Code of Iowa); (ii) taxes for the payment of bonds and interest of each taxing district; (iii) taxes imposed under Section 346.27(22), Code of Iowa, related to joint county-city buildings; and (iv) any other exceptions under Section 403.19, Code of Iowa, shall

be collected against all taxable property within the Urban Renewal Area without any limitation as hereinabove provided.

Section 4. Unless or until the total assessed valuation of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area exceeds the total assessed value of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area as shown by the assessment roll referred to in Section 2 of this Ordinance, all of the taxes levied and collected upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts as taxes by or for the taxing districts in the same manner as all other property taxes.

Section 5. At such time as the loans, advances, indebtedness, bonds and interest thereon of Iowa County, State of Iowa, referred to in Section 3 hereof have been paid, all monies thereafter received from taxes upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts in the same manner as taxes on all other property.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed. The provisions of this Ordinance are intended and shall be construed so as to fully implement the provisions of Section 403.19, Code of Iowa, as amended, with respect to the division of taxes from property within the Urban Renewal Area as described above. In the event that any provision of this Ordinance shall be determined to be contrary to law, it shall not affect other provisions or application of this Ordinance which shall at all times be construed to fully invoke the provisions of Section 403.19, Code of Iowa, with reference to the Urban Renewal Area and the territory contained therein.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law. All aye, motion carried.
